FMEC Announces 2022 Poster Presentation Winners

DAYTON, OHIO – Each year, at the Annual Meeting of the Family Medicine Education Consortium (FMEC), the best scientific posters are presented with awards to recognize their excellence.

The FMEC 2022 Annual Meeting was held September 16-18, 2022, at the Hyatt Regency Crystal City in Arlington, VA. Nearly 600 family practice faculty and residents and 300 medical students attended the meeting. They represented over 90 residency programs and 51 medical schools, primarily in the northeast region of the United States.

A total of 94 posters were presented at the meeting. The FMEC recognized 10 posters, including two each for First Prize and Second Prize, and six for Third Prize. All posters were accepted in the summer of 2022 for their relevance and importance to the field of family medicine, and they were judged for their visual impact, clarity of message, readability and other factors by a panel of family physician reviewers.
